Statement of Sam A. Cabral, President of the International Union of Police Associations, on Law Enforcement Appreciation Day

Today is Law Enforcement Appreciation Day throughout this great nation. It is a day that Americans give thanks to the brave men and women who protect their communities. It is well deserved.

In 2022, 229 Law Enforcement Officers died in the line of duty – 60 by gunfire.

Total Line of Duty Deaths: 229

There were 323 officers shot, 124 in ambush attacks.

As of August of 2022, many law enforcement suicides are now recognized as line of duty deaths so the numbers, unfortunately, will continue to increase.

Obviously, any number of line-of-duty deaths are too many. We, at the International Union of Police Associations, recognize daily the sacrifices that are made and, as importantly, the sacrifices that our law enforcement officers face every day when they gear up and go into the night.

We also recognize the terrible losses these deaths inflict on others. Each of these heroes had a family – spouse, children, mothers, fathers, brother and sisters, partners; all of whom will carry the hurt into their futures. We pray that their memories, the closeness of their families and friends, the passage of time and the grace of God will eventually ease their pain.

We will continue to support our members in their missions and advocate for additional funding, training, equipment, and political support that might help in lowering these tragic numbers.
