Statement of President Sam A. Cabral Regarding 9/11

We will never forget:

At 8:46 A.M. on 9/11/2001, a Tuesday morning, a highjacked aircraft, piloted by Islamic terrorists crashed into the World Trade Center beginning the deadliest terrorist attack in the history of this great nation. By days end, another hijacked commercial aircraft had hit the second tower as another was thwarted by courageous passengers enroute to our Nation's Capital. A fourth plane was flown into the Pentagon.

We will never forget:

Nearly 3,000 Americans lost their lives that day, including 343 Firefighters and 72 Law Enforcement Officers. Since then, hundreds more first responders have died due to medical complications arising from their exposure to toxic chemicals at Ground Zero. Each year, that number of lost lives continues to grow.

We will never forget:

These brave men and women willingly rushed into collapsing buildings to save lives, sacrificing theirs in these selfless efforts.

Today we honor and give thanks to those brave men and women as well as their survivors. We recognize their sacrifice and willingness to run into danger to fulfill their oath and save those they have sworn to protect; and we make a solemn vow, that on this day and every day – we will never forget.
